## 10. BA (HONS) IN ISLAMIC HISTORY AND CIVILIZATION

# 10.2 Entry Requirements

The entry requirement for the BA (Hon's) in Islamic History and Civilization is a Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC), A-level, Alim or any other equivalent level of education recognized by the authority, and falling any other conditions that may be required by the authority.

## 10.3 Admission

Admission into the BA (Hon's) in Islamic History and Civilization program is on a competitive basis. Candidates seeking admission to the program are selected on the basis of past academic records, a written test and/or a viva examination.

# 10.4 Graduation Requirements

For a BA (Hon's) in Islamic History and Civilization degree, a student will have to complete a four-year integrated program consisting of 144 credit hours (48 courses), of which 90 credit hours (30 courses) are core courses while the remaining 30 credit hours (10 courses) are from a general inter-disciplinary body of knowledge. A student must obtain at least a 'C' grade to pass any individual course.

The Course Contents are arranged and presented in a way that avoids unnecessary factual details and emphasizes major themes and trends to get across the twin objectives to students. The students attending this course are expected to be made aware of the past, present, and future of Bangladesh.

The course will promote the role of economic perspective of Islam. It will discuss the utility and significance of Zakat, Ushr, Kharaj and al-Ghaninah. Besides, this course covers Baitulmal-beginning and development, Bai, Muzarabah, Murabaha, Musharaka, Iqta, revenue system, Agricultural production, taxes, technology, Changes in rural society, and so on.

# 0222-2311 Development of Muslim Art and Architecture.

Islamic art encompasses the visual arts produced in the Islamic world. Islamic art is difficult to characterize because it covers a wide range of lands, periods, and genres, including Islamic architecture, Islamic calligraphy, Islamic miniature, Islamic pottery, and textile arts such as carpets and embroidery. It comprises both religious and secular art forms. Religious art is represented by calligraphy, architecture and furnishings of religious buildings, such as mosque fittings, woodwork and carpets. Secular art also flourished in the Islamic world, although some of its elements were criticized by religious scholars. The typical expression of Muslim art is the arabesque, both in its geometric and in its organic form—one leaf, one flower growing out of the other, without beginning and end and capable of almost innumerable variations, only gradually detected by the eye, which never lose their charm. Traditional Islamic art forms include: architecture, painting, ceramic tiles/pottery, luster-ware and calligraphy, among many others.
